



Code of Conduct

for parents at Forest Lakes Y5 & Y6 Camp 2018

- ▲ Be ready to help out
 - ensure the wellbeing of all campers by following health and safety protocols
 - parents will be assigned to activity, duty, and cabin groups - you will spend most of your time with these groups, running or helping to run activities, and helping groups carry out their rostered duties.
 - parent helpers will not always be with their own child
 - use your initiative within these guidelines
- ▲ Stick to the plan and join in
 - parents may not remove themselves, or take their own child out of programmed activities
 - follow the camp timetable and support children to do the same
- ▲ Actively supervise and encourage tamariki
 - during all activities, free-time and meal times
 - take on the role of 'camp mum' or 'camp dad' for your groups
 - leave your business and personal calls, emails and other distractions until after camp
- ▲ Notice problems and tell the person in charge
 - be supportive of Camp staff and teachers
 - maintain your personal wellbeing and inform the teacher in charge of anything that may impact on your ability to carry out your role
- ▲ Be encouraging and caring
 - only teachers and children's own parents will attend to problem behaviours of students
- ▲ Ensure that you are never alone with any child other than your own
 - stay with the group
 - be where where the timetable requires you to be
- ▲ Preserve other's privacy
 - only your own children can be in your social media posts
 - only school personnel communicate information to other parents
- ▲ Remember our school policy prohibits
 - smoking, alcohol, and recreational drugs
- ▲ Model the 4 Rs
 - Respect / **Manaaki**
 - Responsibility / **Takohanga**
 - Resourcefulness / **Kakama**
 - Resilience / **Manawaroa**
